Shaykh Dr. Muḥammad Saʿīd Ramaḍān al-Būṭī was born in 1929 near the village of Jilka, Būṭan (Turkish Kurdistan). In 1933 he migrated to Damascus (Syria) together with his father, Mullā Ramaḍān ﷺ. There the Shaykh followed his father's footsteps in becoming a leading Shāfiʿī scholar of this blessed city. In Damascus Shaykh al-Būṭī



completed his secondary studies at the Institute of Islamic Guidance after which he joined the Faculty of Religion at al-Azhar University receiving his degree in 1955. The following year, he joined the Faculty of Arabic at al-Azhar. He was appointed as Dean in the Faculty of Religion at Damascus University in 1960, and deputed to al-Azhar University for his doctorate in *uṣūl al-fiqh*. In 1965 he was appointed as an instructor in the College of Law at Damascus University. Later, he was appointed as its Dean, then as the Chief of the Department of Tenets and Religions, and finally as the Head of the Beliefs and Religions Department at the Faculty of Islamic Law. Shaykh al-Būṭī is an active participant in many conferences and symposia. He is a member of the Royal Society of Islamic Civilization Research in Amman, as well as the High Council of Oxford Academy. He lectures regularly in the mosques of Damascus and other Syrian cities. Thousands attend his lectures, in addition to the millions that watch his weekly lectures on Iqra Satellite Television. He writes in several newspapers and journals, and gives Islamic rulings for the masses. Shaykh al-Būṭī has written over forty books on the sciences of religion, society and many other subjects.
